The college report was submitted to the members of the Governing Council and presented by Dr. Rashmi J Bhat, the convenor as per the Agenda.

Admissions

We have 31 students admitted to BASLP for this academic year 2021-22 i.e. 10 students from Kerala, 14 from Karnataka, 3 from Tamil Nadu. 1 from Delhi, 1 from Sikkim, 1 from Faridabad, Haryana and 1 from Tripura. The classes have commenced from 25th October 2021.

Bengaluru North University Counselling for M.Sc was held in February and the classes commenced from 16th February 2022. As per RCI, there is no MASLP course from this academic year. There are 11 students in M.Sc Audiology & 11 in M.Sc Speech Language Pathology against the intake of 12 each for Speech and Audiology.



PGDAVT & D.SE (HI) - There are no admissions for the year 2021-22,

Short term courses: 4 batches of Fellowship program in Swallowing are completed and the 5th batch is expected to commence from 25th April 2022. The duration is increased to 4 months based on the feedback of the students.

1 batch of fellowship in Cochlear Implant is completed with 1 student in the 2^{nd} batch.

DSE (HI): The results of 2019-21 batch were announced and all the 4 students passed and all are employed. 1 student of 2020-22 batch has passed 1st and 2nd sem and pursuing 3rd semester.

The clinical statistics of Department of Speech Language Studies, Hearing Studies, Psychology, Camps and ENT were presented. It was informed that there is an immense increase in the case load compared to previous reporting period.

Minutes of the 39th Governing Council meeting held on 6th February 2023 at 11.00 am at Dr. S.R. Chandrasekhar Institute of Speech and Hearing, Hennur Main Road, Bangalore - 560084

39th Governing Council Meeting under Bengaluru North University was conducted on 6th February 2023 at the Seminar Hall of Dr. S. R. Chandrasekhar Institute of Speech and Hearing

In the absence of Chairman and Director Ln. V. V. Krishna Reddy, Tresearur Mr. Shanthavadan welcomed the gathering. The Convener, Dr. Rashmi J Bhat, presented the minutes of the previous Governing Council meeting held on 13th April 2022 which was accepted by the members present. The College Report was presented by the Convener as per the Agenda.

Admissions:- Totally 28 students are admitted to BASLP, 10 for MSc Audiology, 9 for MSc Speech Language Pathology, 7 for DSE(HI), Fellowship in Swallowing 7, and 1 student for Fellowship in Clinical Audiology.

College Report included details of UG and PG results, Award and achievements, Best paper awards received by staff and students, faculty participation in conferences, Faculty participation as resource persons and Representation at ISHA Convention in Delhi. It also included details of faculty as chairpersons in University bodies and as Subject Experts in state committees as well as delegates at conferences. Projects undertaken by the institute were listed out. Faculty training, student enrichment programmes and talks organized at the Institute by external faculties, Expert series lectures and Value Added courses for students were highlighted. The Convenor also mentioned that an academic audit was conducted in June 2022 for the new faculty. Light was thrown on Infrastructure Development – in terms of purchase of books and journals to the library, addition of new equipment as well as recruitment position of faculty – Clinical Supervisor Grade I and Clinical Supervisor Grade II as replacement for the ones who resigned.

The members were given updates about Institute Journal, Celebration of Founder's Day and Graduation Day, International Yoga Day and World Earth Day, visit of Dr. SRC fellow and Awareness building activities. Convenor later elaborated the Clinical Statistics of Department of Hearing Studies, Speech Language Studies, ENT, Psychology unit and Outreach programmes. The report also had information about the activities of SASH, Collaborations and the new activities that were taken up during this reporting period. Report ended with future plans and requests for action from the management.

Once the report presentation was complete, members discussed on several issues raised during the presentation. Dr. Ashok suggested about adopting of one BBMP school in the vicinity and opined carrying out regular screening and follow up would be good. Regarding NSS activities, Br. Victor Raj is willing to collaborate with our college. Dr. Yamini B.K and Dr. Maiya suggested offering incentives to students, if their papers are awarded as Best papers for conferences. Treasurer Mr. Shanthavadan also agreed for this. It was decided to issue Certificates to such students during Graduation Day. Dr. Ashok opined that a Student Publication award can also be given in addition to the above.

The Principal emphasized the need for Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) and policy papers for the Rules and Regulations of the College/Institute, as these are mandatory for NAAC.

Regarding the activities of BSHRF whether to be included with college activities, Dr. Ashok suggested that Institute can make a MOU with BSHRF or as an extension collaboration with Research Unit. Br. Victor Raj, Dr. Yamini B. K and Dr. P.S Maiya agreed for the same. With respect to results of VI semester students being poor, the members suggested to do a detailed analysis of the result, to find which subject were difficult for the students, to identify the slow learners to provide remedial teaching. It was the opinion of all that separate faculty has to take care of this.

Dr. Maiya sought the reason for faculty attrition and asked whether it is due to low payment to which Treasurer opined that salary revision and enhancement has been done. Regarding research, members suggested the faculty have to be encouraged for doing Ph.D and have to be supported by the Management.

Regarding Attendance and classes, Dr. Ashok suggested that LMS (Learning Management System) is to be followed, so that these issues can be streamlined. The Chairman of the Governing Council also enquired about the BSc Psychology Honors and Post Graduate Diploma in Rehabilitation Psychology courses, and the availability of staff for both courses. Dr. Br. Victor Raj opined that part time faculty have to be appointed for Kannada, English and Hindi for the first year of the course, from second year onwards full time faculty will be preferred, with respect to BSc Psychology Honors.

Dr. Yamini B. K wanted more information about Value Added Courses, she suggested that it needs to be funded by Institute and segregated courses are required for Audiology and Speech Language Pathology. Syllabus needs to be clearly designed for the same. She also suggested that Sign Language has to be given priority and it is the biggest plus point of the institute that we have a dedicated Sign Language Unit. All the members opined that the College report was well prepared and presented. The importance given to research was found to be remarkable. Dr. Yamini thanked the members for inviting her to be a part of Governing Council and she said she will be lending all possible support and co-operation to us.

Principal concluded by conveying thanks to all the members.
